
Although she has never sponsored a class or a club, she sponsors the whole student body!


















FACES OF KNOWLEDGE. . .

BHS Personnel Keeps Things Running Smoothly











Homecoming Brings Work, Fun, and Competition


































Stu-Co's major project was sponsoring a foreign school abroad. It is to be built with funds contributed by Bonner organizations and named after Bonner Springs, Kansas.



Staff Reports News


