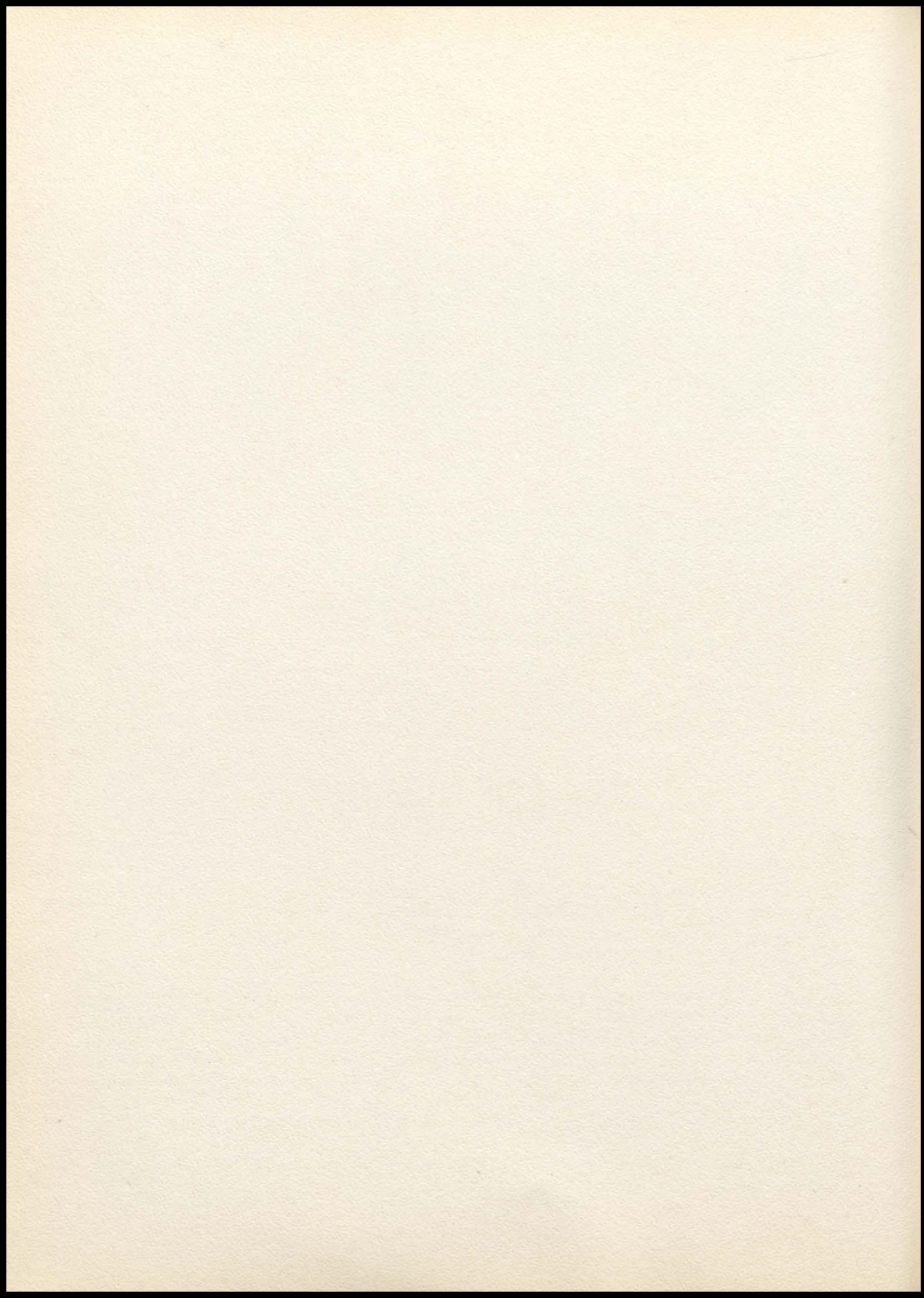
## THE NEW BUILDING

The plans were drawn up sometime in the early spring, and it is intended that the work should begin immediately on the new addition to our high school. The addition will include a gymnasium, auditorium, vocational agriculture department and shops, and the music department.

It is believed that the remodeling will adequately take care of the needs of the Bonner Springs High School for many years to come.



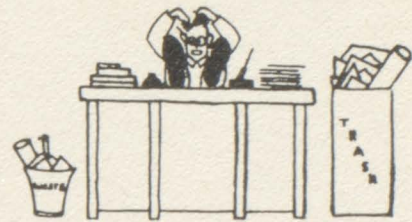
