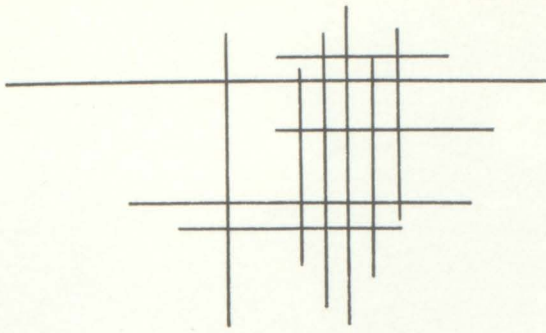
DEDICATION

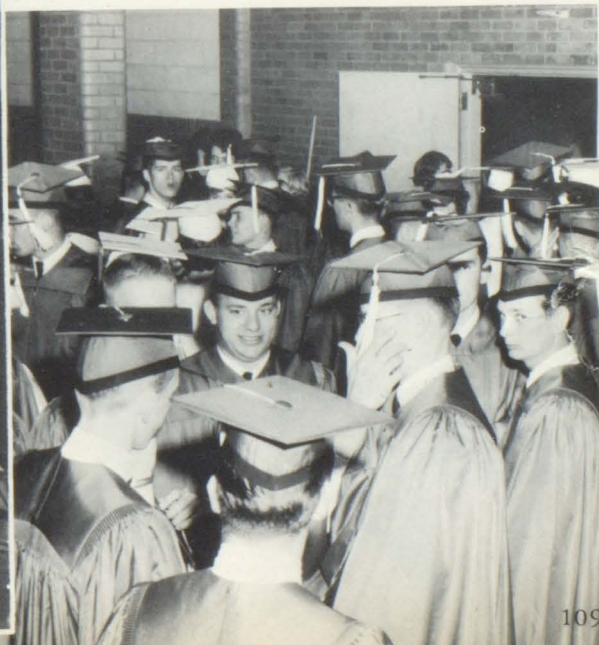


BACCALAUREATE
